Play-Based Learning

Here at Bon View, we believe that a play-based curriculum is the most appropriate and effective preparation for young children. Spontaneous, voluntary, self-directed play provides children with greater cognitive, physical and social understanding of the world around them. Although it may appear to us that children are "just playing", for children, play is the hardest work they do as they grow and develop. Teachers at Bon View create an environment that supports and enhances children's play and actively engage with



children in the class while honoring each child's individual skills and abilities. Learning through play leads to these advantages:

1. Helps build a strong educational foundation by developing a broad knowledge base and reallife skills. *"Play is the cement holding the foundation together and it is the foundation that will* in turn support the house of higher learning." Lisa Murphy

- 2. Helps develop an abundance of imagination and creativity. These children can "think outside of the box" and be problem-solvers by constructing limitless solutions and not just striving for one right answer. *"It can't be in the mind until it's been in the hand and the body." Bev Boss*
- 3. Helps create a natural love of learning that continues throughout their lives.
- 4. Helps support happiness throughout life by providing well-practiced social skills and successful interpersonal relationships. Play turns children into social human beings.
- 5. Builds self-esteem and promotes risk taking in trying new things and ideas in all areas.
